Update on Star Cruises Safety and Security Procedures

As the leading cruise line in Asia-Pacific, Star Cruises Asian fleet is fully compliant with international standards for safety and security. We lead the cruise industry with our stringent safety and security procedures. In 2003, our liner SuperStar Aries (which has since been sold), became the first passenger ship worldwide to obtain an International Ship Security Certificate under the International Ship and Port Facility Security Code (ISPS) before 1 June 2004, the mandatory date for fulfilling licencing requirements. Subsequently, all ships in Star Cruises fleet followed suit and obtained their International Ship Security Certificates.

As a responsible corporate citizen, Star Cruises always places safety and security issues as its first priority. We constantly keep abreast of the changing demands of modern technology. In 2010, Star Cruises initiated a plan and program for Security Enhancement onboard our Asian fleet. As part of the enhancement, Star Cruises will upgrade its security equipment with a new generation of X-RAY machines featuring improved technologies in the detection of both explosives and drugs. We expect to install the first unit on our Taiwan-based cruise ship.

Star Cruises is dedicated to working closely with local authorities to maintain a safe and healthy travel environment for our guests.
